Growth and development occur across the life stages and focuses on the physical, intellectual, emotional and social changes that humans go through (also known as PIES)

Health and Social Care professionals use **growth and developmental milestones** in order to measure whether an individual is in line with the expectation of others at the same age.

If an infant or child is not meeting a specific milestone, such as an infant still not being able to sit up by 12 months, this may indicate a developmental condition that requires further investigation.
