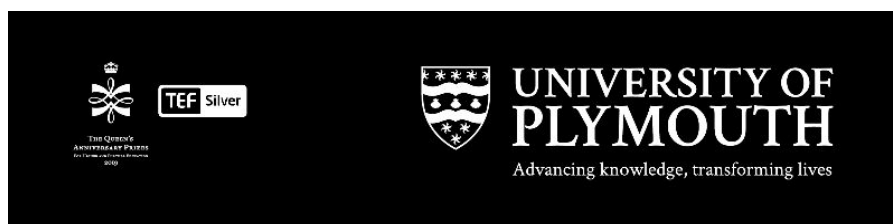
Step Into Bath

Step into Bath is a free, online programme for Year 12 students which will help them to make a competitive university application and to develop some of the key study skills needed to succeed at university. This one week programme and features a one-hour online session each day (Monday - Friday) on a different theme.

Step into Bath will run between **19 - 23 July 2021 and 26 - 30 July 2021**. The week your students join depends on the undergraduate course they are interested in applying for.

To be considered for a place on Step into Bath, students will need to have obtained at least six GCSEs at grades A* to B or 9 to 6, and at least a grade C or 4 in GCSE English and Mathematics (or equivalent in an alternative qualification).
