

CHOOSING YOUR STUDY PROGRAMME

When you choose your subjects, think about how you're giving yourself a good foundation for achieving your career aims.

This Prospectus will help you choose courses that you are interested in studying and which give you the pathway to the next stages of your career aspirations whether that be to University, Apprenticeships or joining the workforce straight from College.

We strongly recommend that you visit one of our Open Evenings where you will have the opportunity to meet staff and students and gather as much information about the courses on offer and what life at Woking College is like.

We understand that choosing your courses can be daunting so we say a big "DON'T WORRY", we will be there to provide you with help and guidance. We will discuss your subject options with you at your interview, at Welcome Day and at enrolment when you have received your GCSE grades. We want to make sure that you choose the best subject combinations to succeed and enjoy your time at College. We are here every step of the way to advise and guide you.

You will have the opportunity to discuss your chosen courses in further detail at your personal interview following your application to the College.

Here are some examples of typical student programmes.



ADVANCED LEVEL (A LEVEL COURSES)

To study A Levels, you will need at least five GCSE passes with grades 4-9.

We will discuss final entry requirements for your chosen course during your interview. Subjects such as Mathematics, English, and the Sciences will require students to have specific grades - for example, to study Physics you will need at least a 6 in GCSE Maths. Woking College offers a wide range of subject choices (see page 12 onwards).

Most students study three A Levels but it is possible to study four. You will be given careful guidance at your interview, helping you to select the right number and combination of subjects.

ADVANCED VOCATIONAL COURSES

If you want to concentrate on a particular subject area and prefer the focus of assessment to be on coursework and assignments rather than exams, our selection of Advanced Vocational courses will give you the chance to experience the world of work. To study these qualifications you will need four or more GCSE passes with grades 4-9, depending on the subject area and course chosen. See page 12 for the range of subjects. Woking College offers two routes to achieving vocational qualifications at Advanced Level.

Advanced Vocational courses are a two-year programme equivalent to one, two, or three A Levels. To study for Advanced Vocational courses at Level 3 you will need four passes at GCSE with grades 4-9. This path provides a sound basis for further training, university entrance, or progression to employment within a vocational sector.

To study one of these courses, you will need at least four GCSE passes at grade 4 or above. These full-time vocational courses can, if completed successfully, lead to study at Advanced Level. The majority of students who attend the College to complete a one-year programme return for a second year to continue with an

GCSE COURSES

For those students who attain less than the equivalent of four grades 4-9 at GCSE and/or do not have at least a 4 in English/ Mathematics, the College operates a GCSE programme in English and Mathematics. ADVANCED LEVEL STUDY

(2 YEAR COURSES)

As all A Level courses have moved to the new linear specifications, the majority of students will take three courses, or the equivalent combination of Vocational and A Levels, alongside their enrichment and tutorial activities. Personalised support and guidance will be given at interview, and some students will be able to undertake four A Level options. Students will also have the option of undertaking the highly regarded Extended Project Qualification as part of their studies and being part of the challenging Excellence Programme.

3D DESIGN

> (A LEVEL)

3D Design is a broad, diverse, practical course which uses a wide range of materials and techniques to research, design, develop, model and make three dimensional products/pieces that explore personal interests. Students experiment creatively through traditional making techniques as well as 3D digital technologies such as CAD/CAM.

Final design pieces are exhibited in our Art & Design show at The Lightbox Gallery in Woking. Students go on to complete degree courses Product Design, Architecture and Theatre Design or to pursue further creative study on an Art Foundation Course.



APPLIED SCIENCE

(ADVANCED VOCATIONAL)

The course covers a mix of Biology, Chemistry and Physics with particular emphasis placed on the topics of forensic science, genetics and chemical analysis. Students carry out an independent investigative project and benefit from a range of assessment methods including laboratory work, coursework and written exams.

Most students go on to a variety of degree programmes such as BioSciences, Forensic Science, Paramedicine and Nursing, whilst career opportunities include scientific and technical posts in laboratories and industry.

ART AND DESIGN

> (ADVANCED VOCATIONAL)

Students on this course work to a range of diverse Art and Design briefs across the different disciplines such as Photography, Painting, Animation, Printing, Illustration, Graphics, 3D and Mixed Media. This course is ideal for the student who enjoys exploring and combining different creative techniques and is interested in a career in the creative arts. As part of the course, students learn how to put on a professional exhibition and are encouraged to get involved with our community projects and live briefs.

Gallery trips are embedded within our studies to enrich and personalise learning. Students have often successfully gone on to university courses in disciplines such as Illustration, Fashion Design, Concept Design as well as Art Foundation courses, apprenticeships or employment within a creative context.



BIOLOGY

> (A LEVEL)

This course is for students who instead of that want to develop a deeper understanding of life on Earth and understand the relationships between all living things. You will learn to record, analyse and interpret data from experiments on organs, cells and animal behaviour. Students have recently attended talks from surgeons, zoologists and food scientists and all have the opportunity to take part in national Biology competitions.

Students often go on to study degrees in Biology, Healthcare, Pharmacology and Neuroscience.



BUSINESS

> (ADVANCED VOCATIONAL)

This course is aimed at developing your understanding of all aspects of business organisations, from marketing and consumer behaviour to finance and the interests of different stakeholders. Students participate in a range of enrichment opportunities including visits to enterprise conferences, trips to business organisations such as the BMW Mini plant and Cadbury's World, as well the opportunity to take part in business competitions at local universities such as a stock market challenge.

Students also participate in a period of work experience and most go on to specialise in a business related degree at university such as Accounting and Finance, Business Management or Marketing.

BUSINESS STUDIES

> (A LEVEL)

This course offers an insight into the world of Business and Finance and prepares students for further study at university or employment. The course covers a wide range of business operations including finance, marketing, human relations, strategic management and leadership.

Enrichment activities have included visits to a range of different types of business organisations such as the Mini factory, Thorpe Park and a local water softener manufacturer as well as overseas trips to Barcelona, Brussels and Paris. Students often continue to Higher Education with a range of business related degree courses at university.





CHILDCARE

> (ADVANCED VOCATIONAL)

This course is aimed at students who ultimately want to work with children by developing the skills and knowledge needed to work with them through practical activities, work experience and curriculum related trips.

Many students go on to Higher Education to complete related degrees such as Primary or Secondary Teaching, Early Years or Youth Work. Some students choose to enter into apprenticeships in early years as an alternative route.

CHEMISTRY

> (A LEVEL)

This course is for students who enjoy problem solving, both mathematical and the written word, before applying the results to the world around them. Students complete plenty of practical work, and all have the opportunity to compete in Chemistry Olympiad competitions.

Students often go on to study degrees in Chemical Engineering, Medicine, Veterinary Science, Biochemistry, Biomedicine and Forensics

CLASSICAL CIVILISATION

> (A LEVEL)

This course is for students interested in the ancient world and how its culture influences our own. We cover a wide range of material, from literature to art and philosophy. Students visit the British Museum and relevant lecture days.

Students go on to study a range of degree courses, such as Classics, History (ancient and modern), English, History of Art and many others, as well as working in a varied field from teaching to museum curatorship.

COMPUTER SCIENCE

> (A LEVEL)

Computer Science enables students to fully participate in the digital revolution which will underpin all our futures, from the essential requirements which enable organisations to function to scientific research into new technologies.

Students are able to take part in the UK Bebras Computing challenge and have also enjoyed trips to the National Museum of Computing at Bletchley Park. Most students go on to Higher Education to undertake Computing related degrees or to embark on apprenticeships with global companies.



CORE MATHEMATICS

> (LEVEL 3 CERTIFICATE)

This course answers the question: "When will I ever need Maths?" It applies and extends GCSE Mathematics to real world situations such as financial calculations, modelling and critical analysis of real everyday calculations and data sources. This oneyear course is equivalent to half an A level and is useful as an extra qualification for those who do not wish to take a full A Level in Mathematics but would like to enter into an apprenticeship, employment or study a degree programme that could include some Mathematics. Previous students have gone on to use the knowledge gained in this course to complete degrees in Business, Psychology, Sociology and Geography amongst others.

CREATIVE DIGITAL MEDIA PRODUCTION

> (ADVANCED VOCATIONAL)

This practical course provides you with the knowledge and skills to generate an outstanding portfolio of productions. You will gain a vast range of technical skills using industry standard filming and editing equipment and software. Students experience trips to Harry Potter World as well as local media businesses. Most students either ao on to study degrees in Higher Education or various media production careers such as cameraperson, sound designer, film editor or producer.



CRIMINOLOGY

> (ADVANCED VOCATIONAL)

Criminology is the scientific study of the nature and causes of crime, the behaviour of criminals and the workings of the Criminal Justice System. The main purpose of Criminology is to understand why people break the law and to develop policies that might stop them.

Students have experienced visits to a magistrates' court, true crime and criminology conferences and visiting speaker lectures from lawyers and police officers. Many go on to further study at Higher Education by combining a degree course with Psychology or Science before embarking on careers in law, police work, probation services, prison or the forensic arena.

DANCE

> (A LEVEL)

Dance is a practical, creative course which has a strona focus on American Jazz Dance and Rambert Dance Company, allowing students to develop their knowledge and performance skills in both Jazz and Contemporary dance. Students will perform regularly throughout the course and also have the opportunity to play key parts in the annual College musical production. Students often go on to study degrees or foundation courses and diplomas in Dance and Musical Theatre.



DIGITAL GAMES PRODUCTION

> (ADVANCED VOCATIONAL)

Digital Games Production is for students who wish to take their passion for gaming to the next step, by learning how to design and develop digital games. Students experience different games engines and professional techniques to develop a broad perspective on the industry.

Students have participated in visits from universities covering the creative generation of game ideas and have visited the British Museum to collect images of real artefacts to use in their own work. Many students continue to further study at university with courses including Games Design and Computer Games Animation and Digital Technologies or to entry-level jobs in the industry.

DRAMA AND THEATRE STUDIES

> (A LEVEL)

Drama and Theatre Studies is a course which develops your practical, academic and creative skills. Students have the opportunity to perform regularly during the course both within College, such as the highly popular annual musical production, or within the wider community, such as local and national drama festivals and competitions. Students also attend the theatre regularly at venues, such as The National Theatre, The Globe and a wide variety of West End venues as well as enjoying workshops with visiting theatre companies and working actors.

Many students progress to study degrees in Drama and Theatre, writing for Performance, Collaborative and Applied Theatre, Acting and Musical Theatre at prestigious institutions such as LAMDA, Rose Bruford College of Theatre and Performance, Central School of Speech and Drama, Guildford School of Acting, Birmingham University and Exeter University.

ECONOMICS

> (A LEVEL)

Economics is a hugely popular and well-regarded subject which provides a fantastic platform for Higher Education in a number of related subject areas including Business, Maths and Politics. The course covers two main areas of study the small scale operation of businesses in terms of revenue, costs and profit and the operation of the economy as a whole in terms of, for example, economic growth and international trade.

Previous educational visits have included the Bank of England and other financial institutions in London as well as overseas trips to Europe. Most students go on to study Economics or Finance at degree level at a wide range of renowned universities.

ENGINEERING

> (ADVANCED VOCATIONAL)

This course covers all key areas of engineering, including mechanical and electrical principles, and is for students who enjoy solving real world problems through the application of mathematical, scientific and technological solutions. Students will develop both theoretical and practical skills, and learning is enhanced through work experience and inspirational visits to or from industry.

Many students go on to study Engineering at degree level, take courses in other related subjects such as computing or design, or undertake engineering apprenticeships.





ENGLISH LANGUAGE

> (A LEVEL)

This course is about understanding the subtle meanings of English Language in varied contexts, such as Child Language Acquisition, language in the media, spoken language and language in relation to gender and power.

Students have the opportunity to hear from visiting University speakers and complete a language investigation into any topic of their choice!

Students often go on to study degrees in Journalism, Creative Writing, Linguistics and Education, as well as becoming Speech and Language Therapists or Teachers.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE AND LITERATURE

> (A LEVEL)

This combined English course offers a unique, practical and engaging insight into texts of all types, alongside producing original creative writing.

Students can expect to engage with visiting speakers and writers, theatrical production trips and a wide range of internal and external writing competitions.

Students who complete this course often go into Higher Education, and it is a logical progression into Creative Writing, Journalism, Media, PR and Teaching careers.



ENGLISH LITERATURE

> (A LEVEL)

English Literature is a course specifically designed for those students with a love of reading and debate. You will study a wide range of texts from Shakespeare in the 17th Century through to 21st Century poetry with a real focus on engaging with the texts and the time periods.

Students should expect a variety of trips to Cultural Institutions and Theatrical Performances, alongside visiting speakers and internal and external writing competitions.

FILM STUDIES

> (A LEVEL)

This course focuses on vour communication and analytical skills and increases your awareness of film form by exploring how miseen-scene, performance, cinematography, editing and sound go together to create meaning. Students have recently visited Brighton Film School and Disneyland Paris to experience film-making first hand. Film Studies will prepare you for degrees and careers which require good communication and analytical ability as well as a future in writing, publishing, film journalism and television or film personnel.

FINE ART

> (A LEVEL)

Fine Art develops a wide range of creative skills to encourage students to express themselves through drawing, painting, sculpture, print and mixed media based work. Students visit a variety of galleries and museums and a programme of visiting artists enriches and underpins their creative practice. Students enjoy exhibiting in the annual summer exhibition at The Lightbox Gallery and go on to study degree courses in a breadth of creative disciplines.

FRENCH/ GERMAN/ SPANISH

> (A LEVEL)

The language courses cover a wide range of current topics such as changes in the family structure in the relevant language speaking countries as well as cyber-society, cinema, young people and politics, labour movements and immigration. Students read a novel and watch a film and are invited to write essays.

Students go on to seek employment or to study a variety of degree courses, some of which are combined degrees such as International Business.





FURTHER MATHS

> (DOUBLE A LEVEL)

This double A-Level aualification is for students who really enjoy and excel in Mathematics. The first year consists of the full A Level in Mathematics whilst the second year extends techniques developed in the first year and brings in more advanced concepts such as 'imaginary' numbers. Students studying this course will typically go on to study Engineering, Mathematics, Physics or Economics at some of the most prestigious universities both in the UK and abroad.



GEOGRAPHY

> (A LEVEL)

This course promotes the links between physical and human geography and helps develop students' quantitative, investigative and analytical skills. Students undertake four days of fieldwork which includes a visit to Tooting to investigate the impact of migration on the urban and cultural landscape, to Kew Gardens to study water and carbon cycles, to Newhaven to collect data on coastal processes and to London South Bank to conduct qualitative fieldwork.

Students often go on to study Geography or other related degrees such as Town Planning, Geology, Development Studies or Geographic Information Systems.

GRAPHIC DESIGN

> (A LEVEL)

The Graphic Design course challenges students to problem-solve by exploring new ideas through a combination of studio-based work and digital software. Study topics include a variety of areas such as advertising, typography, branding, illustration and packaging and cover how designers accept a brief, develop concepts and use industry standard processes. At the end of the year, student work is exhibited in our Art & Design show at The Lightbox Gallery in Woking. Most students go on to complete degrees in Graphic Communication, Illustration and Marketing & Advertising or to further study on an Art Foundation course.

HEALTH AND SOCIAL CARE

> (ADVANCED VOCATIONAL)

This course develops the skills and knowledge needed for careers in the care or education settings.

Students participate in a range of enrichment opportunities including visits to London to explore the history of childhood and play as well as Bethnal Green Children's Museum. Students also participate in a period of work experience and most go on to specialise in education or health degrees at university or apprenticeships in care and education.



HISTORY

> (A LEVEL)

This course is for students interested in developing a critical understanding of social, economic, cultural, political and international processes across time. We explore revolutionary developments which shaped 17th century Britain and the tumultuous road to modernity taken by China and Russia in the 20th century. Students will develop critical skills to interrogate source material and gain a greater understanding of human behaviour by exploring moments of significant and dramatic historical change.

Students go on to study a variety of degree courses, such as History, PPE, International Relations, Philosophy, Politics or go on to jobs in law, the charity sector, the public sector and the media.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

> (ADVANCED VOCATIONAL)

This course gives students the opportunity to learn and develop a wide range of skills in Information Technology including software, security and social media. It equips them with the ability to design, develop and support information systems in all types of organisations.

Students have the opportunity to participate in visiting lectures from academics in key topics such as cybersecurity and hacking activities. Students go on to Higher Education to complete related degree courses in areas including Business Information Systems and Cybersecurity.



LAW

> (A LEVEL)

The Law course is for students who enjoy exploring and debating aspects of the English legal system such as criminal and tort law. Students have recently been on trips to Westminster, the Supreme Court, the local Magistrates' Court and a Criminology Conference to support their knowledge and understanding of the legal system.

Students who complete the course can go on to access a variety of degrees at university including Law and Social Sciences. Students have also gained apprenticeships in the legal sector and careers in the legal and business sectors.



LAW

> (ADVANCED VOCATIONAL)

The course is for students with a keen interest in the English legal system. Students will discover how laws are created, roles within the legal system and look into aspects of criminal law.

Students often go on to study Law or other related degrees such as Business, Social Sciences or Criminology.

MATHS

> (A LEVEL)

This course in Mathematics covers the development of algebraic problem solving skills, alongside statistical methods and physical modelling. It is designed for students who enjoy Mathematics and wish to gain a deeper understanding of the Mathematical techniques used at degree level in subjects such as Computing, Economics, Sciences, Engineering and, of course, Mathematics.

Students also have the opportunity to participate in national Maths challenges as well as competitions in local universities such as an annual stick market challenge.

MEDIA STUDIES

> (A LEVEL)

Media Studies develops your awareness of a range of media issues arising from an increasingly digitally dominated, media-saturated culture in this exciting, theoretical and practical course. Students experience trips to The Guardian and Bournemouth University with many students continuing to study the subject in Higher Education. The course also leads to a range of career opportunities including marketing, advertising, public relations and publishing, as well as careers in the media such as researcher or production assistant.

MUSIC

> (A LEVEL)

Music is a wonderful allround course for the aspiring working musician, whether you aim to be a performer, composer, teacher or musician in some other capacity. Students regularly take part in concerts and musical theatre performances at College and in the wider community and have recently been on trips to the Royal Albert Hall, UCA Farnham and Abbey Road Studios. Many students progress to study degrees in musical disciplines including classical, jazz and popular music performance, music therapy and film composition at prestigious institutions such as Trinity and Leeds Conservatoires, the Guildhall School of Music and Drama and Birmingham University.

MUSIC TECHNOLOGY

> (ADVANCED VOCATIONAL)

The Music Technology course is for students who enjoy practical application of music production skills including recording, processing, sequencing, sampling, synthesis and mixing. Students also complete written evaluations of their work, present findings to peers and carry out an independent research project about a music technology topic of their choice. Students also enjoy trips to universities and other music establishments such as the Abbey Road Institute. Students often go on to study degrees in music production, sound engineering and acoustics.

PERFORMING ARTS

> (ADVANCED VOCATIONAL)

This course allows you to develop your knowledge and understanding of a range of contemporary theatre makers and practitioners, with a particular focus on physical theatre. There are opportunities to create your own performance material in response to a stimulus and perform contemporary texts. Students are taken on backstage tours of theatres, attend a range of productions and interview working actors about their training and careers. Students have many opportunities to perform both in College and in the wider community and many of them go on to degree courses either at Drama Schools or University.

PHILOSOPHY

> (A LEVEL)

The Philosophy course is for students who enjoy questioning the physical and metaphysical nature of the world around them. It includes the topics of knowledge, perception, morality, the origin of the universe and the human mind. Students have recently been to conferences in London, the Museum of the Mind in the Bethlem Hospital and attended talks by academics from Southampton and Chichester Universities.

Students often go on to study degrees across the Humanities and Social Sciences spectrum which allow them to fully utilise their highly developed literary, communication and analytical skills alongside their open perspective on a wide range of issues.

PHOTOGRAPHY

> (A LEVEL)

The Photography course involves using creative approaches which go beyond mere observation and recording. You will use photography as a means of personal enquiry and expression and create artwork using traditional darkroom techniques, digital imaging and film.

Students are able to participate in a variety of visits to exhibitions and galleries and exhibit their own work in our annual Art Exhibition at Woking's Lightbox Gallery. Many students go on to pursue degree courses in Photography or other creative art subjects such as Film, Graphic Design, Architecture and Theatre Design.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

> (A LEVEL)

Physical Education is for students who have an interest in the science behind sports performance, by investigating how physiological, psychological and biomechanical factors can influence the quality of performance. Students have the opportunity to learn more about physiology with a trip to BodyWorlds, London along with fitness training on a residential trip to Club La Santa, Lanzarote. Students often go on to study degrees such as Sports Science, Sports Therapy, Sports Coaching as well as PE Teaching.

PHYSICS

> (A LEVEL)

This course is for students who enjoy using experimental work and mathematics to explore the way the universe works, and applying these physical laws to find technological solutions in everyday life. Students have recently been on trips to Inspirational Physics lectures at Surrey University, had talks on black holes and acoustical engineering by visiting speakers, and had the opportunity to take the British Physics Olympiad.

Many students go on to study Engineering or Physics at degree level, while others find the analytical skills they have developed invaluable for other career paths.

POLITICS

> (A LEVEL)

This course is for students interested in current affairs in the UK and USA. We debate many topics, such as voting systems, human rights, political ideologies and the effectiveness of parliament. Students visit Parliament, the Supreme Court, the Guardian Newspaper and attend an American Politics Conference.

Students go on to study a variety of degree courses, such as International Relations or Political Science, or go to jobs in the public or charity sectors.

PSYCHOLOGY

> (A LEVEL)

Psychology explores research and theories of human and animal behaviour including a variety of topics from the way memory works through to the diagnosis, causes and treatments of mental illness. Students enjoy a range of enrichment opportunities to further develop their subject knowledge and understanding including a visit to London Zoo's phobia clinic, talks from practicing psychologists, participating in the Zimbardo lectures and attending psychology conferences.

Many students go on to specialise in psychology with other subjects at university such as medicine, human resources, business, sports coaching and hospitality, often leading to a wide range of careers including as a Clinical Psychologist in the NHS, as a Forensic Psychologist with the Police and as an Educational Psychologist in schools and colleges.

RELIGIOUS STUDIES

> (A LEVEL)

Religious Studies is for students who enjoy debating about the nature of belief and the continuing impact of religion on society and the world. It includes a depth study of one religion alongside an in-depth study of the philosophy of religion and ethics. Students have recently had visiting speakers from religious and community groups on the subjects of religion and secularism and gender identity.

Students often go on to study a range of different degrees such as Theology, Divinity and Religious Studies.

SOCIOLOGY

> (A LEVEL)

Sociology is aimed at anyone who wants a better understanding of human nature and society. The areas of focus for sociology are diverse, ranging from crime to religion, and from the family and education to identifying divisions in society based on social class, age, gender and ethnicity.

Students have the opportunity to attend a crime conference and revision workshops as well as experiencing taster days at local universities. Many students go on to Higher Education to study Sociology at degree levels leading to a range of career options including areas such as law, police, journalism, teaching and social care. Careers in social policy development are also very popular.

SPORT

> (ADVANCED **VOCATIONAL)**

The Vocational Sport course is for students who enjoy the more practical based components of sport such as sports coaching and fitness testing. Students learn through a mixture of theory and practical lessons covering a variety of units whilst also experiencing a range of sports trips both in the UK and abroad. Students can go on to study degrees such as Sports **Development and Sports** Coaching as well as seeking employment in the sports and fitness industry with sports centre management, sports coaching or personal instructor roles.



STATISTICS


> (A LEVEL)

This course is for students interested in understanding how the data in the world around them is collected. presented, analysed and interpreted and students will leave the course well equipped for the world of 'Big Data'. The course provides a thorough arounding in statistical techniques and analysis and particularly focuses on practical application of statistical techniques to real data sources. This course is useful for students wishing to study Social Sciences, Humanities, Sciences and Statistics at university with many students aiming for fields such as Psychology and Medical Research.

This course is designed for creative minds who enjoy working in a tactile form. Students explore printed, stitched, constructed and manipulated textiles creating fashion or Art Textile pieces. Guest artists host workshops to give a professional context to the work and students are invited to visit exhibitions and galleries which underpin their creative practice. Students are able to exhibit their work in our Art and Design show at The Lightbox Gallery in Woking and enjoy seeing their work in the Annual College **Eashion Show.**



TRAVEL AND TOURISM

> (ADVANCED VOCATIONAL)

This course is for students who have a keen interest in the travel and tourism sector and prepares them for a range of roles within the industry. Topics studied include the principles of marketing, global destinations and customer service. Students have been on trips to Disneyland Paris and Thorpe Park and have engaged in a wide range of interactive learning opportunities.

Students who complete the course can go on to access a variety of degrees at university as well as apprenticeship and career opportunities in the travel and tourism industry.

UNIFORMED SERVICES

> (ADVANCED VOCATIONAL)

The Uniformed Services course is for students who have an interest in joining the Uniformed Services such as the Police. Fire Service. Army, Navy etc. Students gain first-hand experience through trips to Woking Fire Station, Pirbright Army Barracks as well as fantastic visits from the Police and Forces Careers Advisors. Students often go on to study degrees such as Policing as well as seeking employment in the full range of Uniformed Services.

THE WOKING WAY COMBINED ENRICHMENT PROGRAMME

As a College, we are committed to developing and extending opportunities and experiences for our students beyond the classroom.

The Woking Way is a bespoke 5 element programme which enables learners to develop beyond and outside of their academic or vocational studies, preparing themselves for the next steps at university, apprenticeships or in employment. All students work towards achieving their certificates during their time at College and participate in an enrichment activity in addition to their academic programme.

This unique programme sets our students apart and enables them to experience and participate in a range of activities, workshops, lectures, trips and events under the categories of Wellbeing, What Next, Wider Learning, Working with the Community and World of Work. With over 40 enrichment options, in addition to the excellence programme, Stem, short courses and EPQ, there are multiple opportunities open and available to our students.



We challenge students to broaden their learning either as an extension to their chosen courses, through Maths and Science Olympiads, or as an additional learning opportunity with the EPQ programme and LAMDA. We also launched a Lunchtime Lecture programme in 2019.



We recognise that an important part of our role is to support and enable students to look after their own wellbeing. To achieve this component, students will be encouraged to participate in sports enrichment, performing arts, wellbeing workshops and focused events.



We encourage involvement with an array of community endeavours so that students are outward-focused. Schemes include the Duke of Edinburgh Award, mentoring and sports coaching in local schools, taking part in consultations with the WWF and exhibiting artwork at The Lightbox.



We maximise the chances students have to consider their next steps by providing a whole host of events. Students join careers days, higher education fairs and talks, apprenticeship trips and talks, university open days and the Alternatives to University Network, and STEM Breakfast Network.



We support students to gain real-world employment experience through enterprise schemes, employability events, work experience and workshops, trips and external speakers.

Life at Woking College is not only about work and study, as part of our Woking Way Programme we offer a wide range of activities and enrichments which will help you broaden your experiences and gain a competitive edge when it comes to interviews for university or employment.

These cover a huge range of disciplines from our Excellence Programme, STEM and the Extended Project Qualification to over **50 different enrichment activities.** Enrichments are open to all students regardless of whether you are studying these subjects as part of your courses.

EXCELLENCE PROGRAMME

The Excellence Programme is designed to support ambitious, aspirational and high achieving students in their pursuit of excellence at College and in their future progression. The programme is targeted at students who achieve mostly grades 8+ (or equivalent) in their GCSEs and aims to assist and inspire their pursuit for the top universities and professions.

A specialist teacher leads workshops and seminars to expand student skills and perceptions to prepare them for applications to competitive academic institutions and courses. Students are encouraged and supported in applying for residential courses and university study days, which have included attending Sutton Trust summer schools, physical science residential courses at the Cavendish Laboratory in Cambridge, Cambridge Masterclasses in a wide range of subjects and the Cambridge University Shadowing Scheme.

There is a supplementary Oxbridge programme, which includes training from admissions tutors from Oxford and Cambridge throughout the year, workshops to prepare for admissions tests and a full mock interview programme. These activities have ensured a high success rate for our students with all those on the programme having secured a place at Oxford or Cambridge, a Russell Group university or medical school in recent years.



EXTENDED PROJECT QUALIFICATION

The Extended Project Qualification is an independent research project – your opportunity to gain a qualification in whichever area of interest you choose, anything from a hobby to a future career.


The final product can take the form of a written report or an artefact or product/ event. The EPQ involves students taking on independent learning and has teachers acting as supervisors. The EPQ begins after Christmas in year 1 and finishes at the beginning of year 2. You will get timetabled sessions with supervisors who will give you guidance and one-to-one meetings to support your progress. The EPQ is extremely valued by universities as it demonstrates passion and ability in a particular subject. It is worth 28 UCAS points (half an A-level) and can help support your university applications. It also helps you

develop your research and writing skills which will supplement your performance in your A-level exams and BTECs.

For past projects, Woking College students have submitted animations, dance productions, extended essays and videos. This is a great chance to expand your knowledge, pursue your interest and improve your university applications. In 2020 100% of Woking's students achieved A*-C in their project and students who are enthusiastic, passionate and committed will find the EPQ a qualification which extends their academic ability and cultural Capital.



Our short course programme launched in 2021 is led by our highly qualified teaching teams. Over a 4-6 week course students are able to gain an invaluable insight into a range of subjects for example, Ethics in psychology, Exploring the role of technology in healthcare to researching your family tree.



LUNCHTIME LECTURE SERIES

Our highly popular lunchtime lecture programme introduces students to a range of thought provoking and informative topics. Lectures typically last for around 30 minutes during the lunch hour and will widen your understanding of the world around you.



WELLBEING

We understand the importance of supporting the wellbeing of students at Woking College and our Head of Student Wellbeing provides a cross-College programme of events that all students are able to access and get involved in. In addition, they are able to speak to any student who might find themselves struggling with any aspect of life within or outside of College, or who just needs a friendly face and a listening ear.



MY WELLBEING MATTERS

Every month at College we use a different 'My Wellbeing Matters' theme to explore different aspects of wellbeing. Students can access support and advice on how we can all be looking after our wellbeing and making it a priority in our day to day lives. These resources are shared through our Woking College Wellbeing Instagram account, monthly newsletters and videos, and fun interactive activities and events happening in College each month.

GROUP SUPPORT

We are committed to listening and responding to the needs of our students, and offer ongoing support groups which are tailored to particular issues that may be impacting students throughout the year. Group support can be a particularly powerful way of discussing sensitive issues such as social anxiety or bereavement in a safe and supportive space, which helps students to know that they are not alone with whatever they may be going through.

PEER SUPPORTERS

We know that sometimes speaking to a member of staff can feel daunting and is a difficult first step to take. Our Peer Supporters are students who are supported by the Pastoral team and have received training on how to provide listening support to fellow students – and to help these students to access further support from the College pastoral team. Training to be a Peer Supporter also provides students with a deeper understanding of the importance of active listening and empathy, which is something they can take forward into all aspects of life.

LEARNING RESOURCE CENTRE

Our recently remodelled Learning Resource Centre (LRC) is a dedicated area for independent and group study with over 90 networked computers, desks for individual silent study and individual study cubicles with plug sockets so students can work on their own devices using the College Wi-Fi. In addition, we now have a group study room that students can book into to work on ioint assianments, a dedicated room for Independent Learning Mentor meetings and a reading area with comfortable seating.

LEARNING SUPPORT

We aim to provide holistic, personalised and fully integrated support for all students according to their needs and circumstances. In the first few weeks after enrolment, using diagnostic screening, as well as information provided from home and school, Support for Learning staff will create an agreed plan to address any particular needs.

A dedicated, quiet and relaxed Support for Learning area is available in the main building throughout the week, where one-to-one and small group lessons take place and specialist staff in the fields of literacy, numeracy and study skills can provide assistance for students with EHCPs. Students can also gain additional help from Support for Learning staff throughout the week in the LRC. Depending on learning preferences, some in-class support is also available, as well as specific workshops for building confidence, social skills and mentoring.

PERSONAL **TUTORING**

When you enrol at Woking College, you will be assigned a Personal Tutor and be given a comprehensive induction programme to ensure a smooth transition from school to College life. Your Personal Tutor will advise and guide you throughout your programme of study, monitor your progress and assist you in taking the next step to higher education or employment.

#WE18YOSK

We believe that a good education goes beyond the curriculum so the #WF18YOSK programme has been



designed to feature wider knowledge and information that would benefit every 16-19 year old. The #WE18YOSK programme is delivered via tutorial sessions and through extra-curricular opportunities throughout the College. You will see events, resources and speakers with the #WE18YOSK badge and the programme covers a wealth of diverse topics ranging from key figures in history and employability skills through to first aid and top tips for living independently.

HEADS OF YEAR

Our highly experienced Heads of Year are here for you if you have a more complex issue. Whether personal or academic, they can provide comprehensive guidance offering safe and non-judgemental support and advice to students regarding a wide range of issues.

WELFARE AND COUNSELLING

In case you experience any difficulties that could distract you from your studies or work, our Student Counsellors and Safeguarding Officers are in touch with a network of local agencies and can offer advice and support on welfare and personal issues.


There are counsellors on site for help with personal and emotional problems. You can self-refer or alternatively your Personal Tutor can contact counsellors on your behalf.

FACILITIES

Woking College is a contemporary campus College. In the past six years we have received multi-million pound investments to ensure that our facilities match our excellence in courses and education.

Our new facilities include a high tech Science Block and Presentation Theatre, a stunning Art Block, a film and television studio and an extensive Sports Centre and playing fields. A new 3G Sports Pitch and Pavilion opened in 2021.

The College also benefits from IT and Learning Resource Centres, state-of-the-art Music Technology facilities and a professional theatre and dance studio, as well as excellent access to computers, a language studio and a careers centre.





HOW DO I GET THERE?

Woking College is the best-connected College in the region. With excellent rail, road and bus routes, Woking College attracts students from a wide geographical area.

Based on a single site with playing fields, we are placed in a residential area close to the town centre of Woking with good access to a mainline station.

BY TRAIN: Woking College is a 15-minute walk from Woking Station, and a regular bus service connects the station to the College.

BY BUS: The College is on national and local bus routes from the areas of Camberley, Chertsey and Guildford. Subsidised passes for travel between home and the College are available from Surrey County Council.

BY ROAD: The College is easily accessible by road and there is ample free parking for all students and visitors.


BY FOOT: It is a 15-minute walk from Woking town centre.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

FEES

Students who are aged 16-18 on 1 September in the year they start their course at Woking College, have settled status under the EUSS and have lived in the UK or Islands for at least the last three years before the course starts OR have pre-settled status in the UK and have lived in the UK, Gibraltar, EU, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway or Switzerland for at least the last 3 years before the course starts, receive free tuition. They will be exempt from external examination fees during their first sitting at College. Students who do not fulfil the above criteria will be given further information at interview.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The College is able to offer financial assistance in the form of bursaries to help students with the direct costs of study, such as transport, books, and equipment. In addition the College is able to offer free lunches to qualifying students. For further information, visit www.woking.ac.uk.
