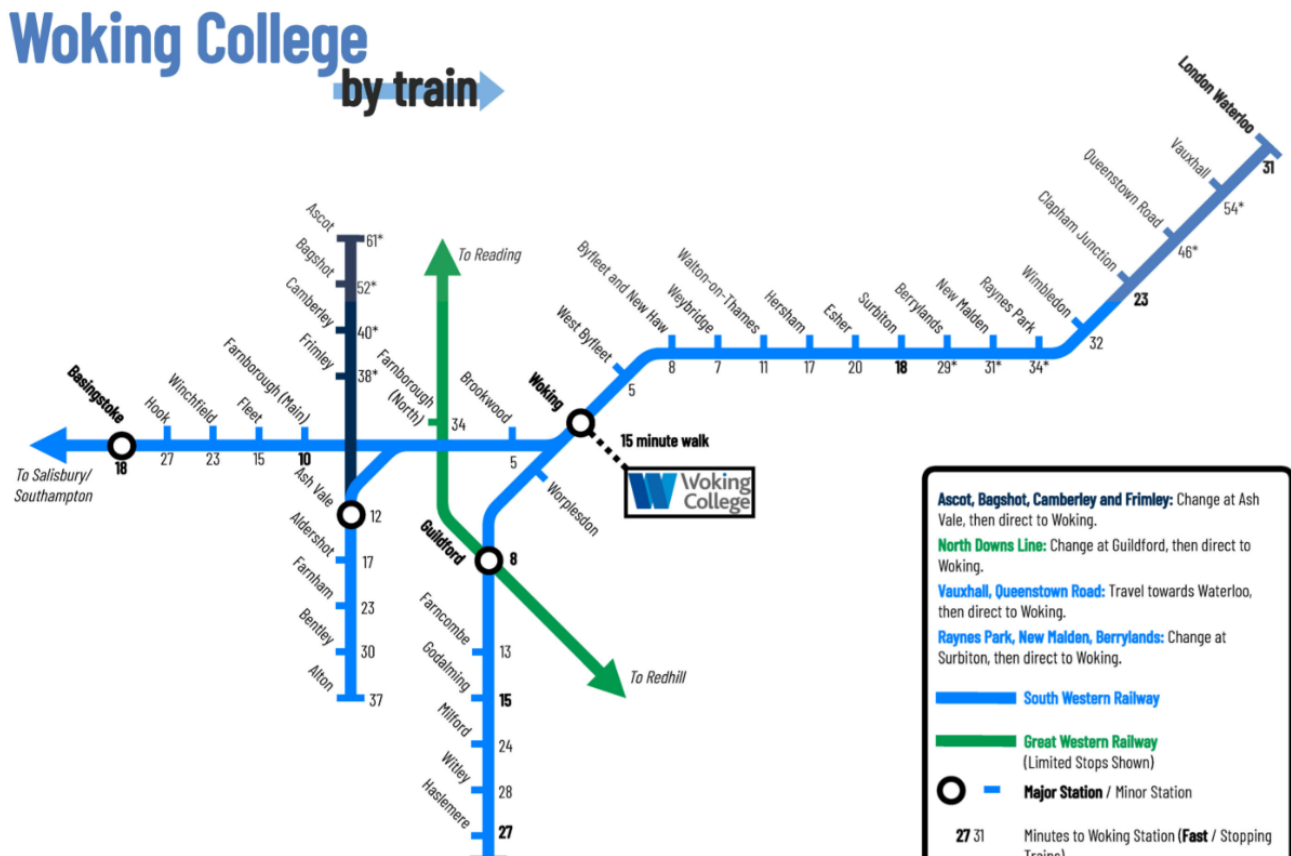


Woking College Transport Guide

Woking College is a well-located Sixth Form College with excellent rail, road and bus routes.

By train: Woking train station is a major hub, offering fast, frequent services to key destinations across the South East. Woking College is a 15-20 minute walk from the train station.



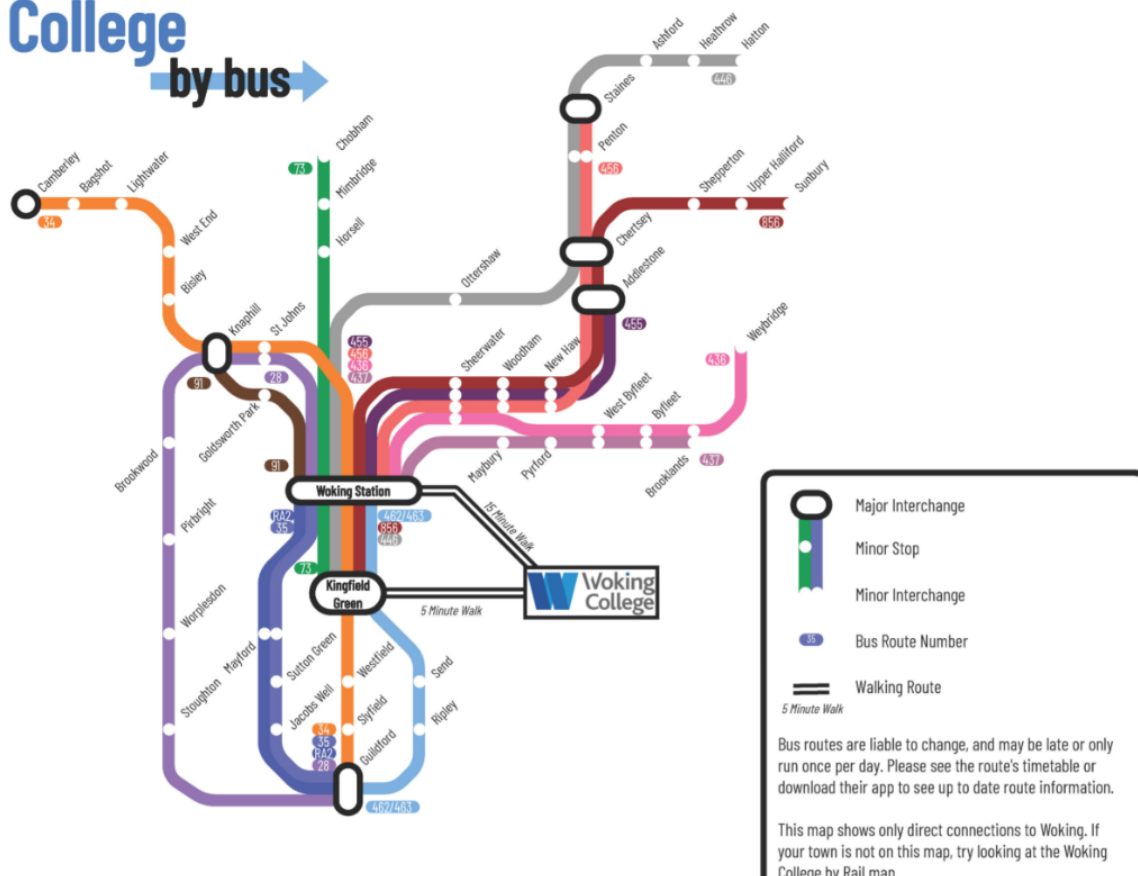
The following Railcards are available to students:

- **16-17 Railcard.** 50% off standard Anytime, Off-Peak, Advance and Season tickets for 16&17 year-olds. £30 fee, valid for one year, or until the holder turns 18, whichever comes first. Apply online at [16-17 Saver | Half Price Travel | Railcards](#)
- **16-25 Railcard.** 1/3 off a range of tickets (does not include season tickets). Minimum fares and time restrictions apply. (It may not be worth buying a 16-25 Railcard, as there is a minimum ticket price at peak times of £12.) £30 fee, valid for one year. Apply online at [16-25 Railcard | Only £35 | Railcards](#)

By bus: The College is on national and local bus routes from the areas of Camberley, Chertsey and Guildford. The government has introduced a new £3 cap on single bus fares in England outside London from 1 January 2025 through to 31 December 2025. Participation in the bus fare cap scheme is voluntary, and some bus companies have chosen not to take part. We recommend purchasing a FREE **Surrey LINK Bus Card** to gain reduced ticket prices. The Surrey LINK card is for young people aged 20 and under who live in Surrey. It can be used on any single or return bus journey that starts and/or finishes in Surrey and allows you to get 50% off the adult fare for the journey you are taking. By road: The College is easily accessible by road and there is free parking for all students and visitors.

By foot: It is a 15-20 minute walk from Woking town centre.
