



YEAR 13 STUDENTS APPLYING TO UNIVERSITY ONLY

To apply to universities through UCAS:

- 1. Complete all sections of your UCAS application (including ULN) and ask your tutor to check through your application and personal statement with you. Change/amend where necessary.**
- 2. Complete your UCAS checklist with predicted grades, attach it to a printed copy of your whole UCAS application and give to your tutor. They will need this for your reference.**
- 3. When your tutor tells you all parts of your application have been correctly completed and they have written your reference, click 'pay and send' (your application will go to Sarah W in Careers, it will not be sent to universities)**
- 4. Go to the Careers office in the LRC and make an appointment to see Sarah W.**
- 5. For the appointment you will need to bring the printed copy of your whole UCAS application & your predicted grade sheet. Your application will be sent at the end of the appointment.**
- 6. Please note I cannot send incorrect applications or applications that you have not paid for prior to the appointment with me. I also cannot send applications if you don't bring the signed UCAS checklist with predicted grades with you to the appointment.**
