# CHOOSING YOUR STUDY PROGRAMME

When you choose your subjects, think about how you're giving yourself a good foundation for achieving your career aims.

This Prospectus will help you choose courses that you are interested in studying and which give you the pathway to the next stages of your career aspirations whether that be to university, apprenticeships or joining the workforce straight from College.

We strongly recommend that you visit one of our Open Evenings where you will have the opportunity to meet staff and students and gather as much information about the courses on offer and what life at Woking College is like.

We understand that choosing your courses can be daunting so we say a big "DON'T WORRY", we will be there to provide you with help and guidance. We will discuss your subject options with you at your interview, at Welcome Day and at enrolment after you have received your GCSE grades. We want to make sure that you choose the best subject combinations to succeed and enjoy your time at College. We are here every step of the way to advise and guide you.

You will have the opportunity to discuss your chosen courses in further detail at yourpersonal interview following your application to the College.



## **Advanced Level (A Level Courses)**

To study A Levels, you will need at least five GCSE passes with grades 4-9.

We will discuss final entry requirements for your chosen course during your interview. Subjects such as Mathematics, English, and the Sciences will require students to have specific grades – for example, to study Physics you will need at least a 6 in GCSE Maths. Woking College offers a wide range of subject choices (see page 12 onwards).

Most students study three A Levels but it is possible to study four. You will be given careful guidance at your interview, helping you to select the right number and combination of subjects.

## **Advanced Vocational Courses**

If you want to concentrate on a particular subject area and prefer the focus of assessment to be a combination of coursework, assignments and exams, our selection of Advanced Vocational courses will give you the chance to experience the world of work. To study these qualifications you will need four or more GCSE passes with grades 4-9, depending on the subject area and course chosen. See page 12 for the range of subjects. Woking College offers two routes to achieving vocational qualifications at Advanced Level.

Advanced Vocational courses are a two-year programme equivalent to one, two, or three A Levels. To study for Advanced Vocational courses at Level 3 you will need four passes at GCSE with grades 4-9. This path provides a sound basis for further training, university entrance, or progression to employment within a vocational sector.

## PRE-ADVANCED AND GCSE COURSES

For students who do not achieve the GCSE results that they need to study at Advanced Level, Woking College offers a choice of:

- Level 2 in Applied Science
- Level 2 in Art and Design
- Level 2 in Business
- Level 2 in Health & Social Care
- Level 2 in IT

- Level 1 in Travel & Tourism

To study one of these courses, you will need at least four GCSE passes at grade 4 or above. These full-time vocational courses can, if completed successfully, lead to study at Advanced Level. The majority of students who attend the College to complete a one-year programme return for a second year to continue with an Advanced

#### **GCSE** courses

For those students who attain less than the equivalent of four grades 4-9 at GCSE and/or do not have at least a 4 in English /Mathematics, the College operates a GCSE programme in English and Mathematics. We also offer literacy and numeracy qualifications, which can be studied alongside main programmes. Detailed course content is available at www.woking.ac.uk

We will make sure you select the right combination of subjects to meet your individual learning needs and career aspirations. The course entry requirements and progression routes to higher education and employment will be discussed at interview and enrolment.

## ADVANCED LEVEL STUDY

2 YEAR COURSES

As all A Level courses have moved to linear specifications, the majority of students will take three courses, or the equivalent combination of Vocational and A Levels, alongside their enrichment and tutorial activities. Personalised support and guidance will be given at interview, and some students will be able to undertake four A Level options. Students will also have the option of undertaking the highly regarded **Extended Project Qualification** as part of their studies and being part of the challenging **Excellence Programme.**

## THESE ARE OUR STUDENTS' 12 MOST FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



Woking College is an oversubscribed College so we advise you apply as early as possible in your late Yr.10 or early Yr.11. We have two Open Evenings in June (your Yr.10) and October (your Yr.11) and we advise that you come and look around the College and meet staff and students before you submit your application.

## Q Do you interview applicants?

A Yes, we invite all applicants for an interview where you can discuss your subject options and ask any questions you might have to help you decide if Woking College is the right place for you.

## How many students are there in classes?

A This depends on the subject but an average size class is 18. Some classes are smaller but classes are usually no more than 20 students.

## How will I get to know people when I join?

A Students come to us from over 75 different schools so there is a great mix of new students to meet. The College is renowned for its inclusive, friendly community and as one of the smaller Sixth Form Colleges you won't get lost in the crowd! We encourage students to take part in enrichments and join clubs and societies where you will meet other students with similar interests.

## **Q** What is a typical day at College?

A typical day at College depends on which subjects you are studying as all students timetables are tailor made to suit their study needs. In general, each A Level and BTEC subject has four and a half hours of teaching per week and there is time for private study which is best conducted in College. The day starts at 8.45am and ends at 4pm and students are required to attend College five days per week. There is time allocated for the many enrichment activities available.

## **Q** What is The Excellence Programme?

The Excellence Programme is designed to support ambitious and high achieving students in their pursuit of excellence at the College and in their future progression. The programme is targeted at students who achieve mostly grades 8+ in their GCSEs and aims to assist and inspire their pursuit for the top universities and professions. You can read more about the programme on page 18 of this prospectus and on our website.

## Are there extra-curricular activities I can get involved with?

Yes, the College has one of the best enrichment programmes in the region with over 75 different activities to choose from, including Sport, Music, Drama, D of E, Gold Arts Award, Debating Society and Book Clubs. All students are required to take part in at least one enrichment activity with many choosing two or more.



A Yes, providing your choices can be accommodated within your timetable. For some students this is a very good combination.

## What happens if I need extra learning support with my studies?

A The College aims to provide holistic, personalised and fully integrated support for all students who need it at any time.

In the first few weeks after enrolment, using diagnostic screening as well as information provided from home and school, our learning support team will create an agreed plan to address any needs. You can read more about our Support for Learning on page 36 of this prospectus and on our website.

## Will I get help with my university and apprenticeship applications?

Yes, teachers and tutors are very experienced in handling university and apprenticeship applications and our dedicated careers department are there to help you with your UCAS choices and in your application to top grade apprenticeships. All applications and personal statements are checked by personal tutors and our University and Careers Advisor. Throughout the year visiting universities are invited into the College to advise on university applications.

## When it comes to careers advice what help can I expect?

The College has a dedicated Careers team who offer advice on careers, Higher Education and apprenticeships. In March there is a Higher Education event for Yr.12 parents and carers and two careers mornings for students in March and June. Our June Careers Event attracts over 100 universities and leading national and international businesses. Throughout the year visiting speakers such as KPMG, Proctor & Gamble and McLaren are invited into College to advise students on their career choices.

# How does the College communicate with my parents/carers and let them know how I am doing?

We predominately communicate with parents/carers via email and the email service Brevo. Parents and carers are kept fully informed of each student's academic achievements and their personal and social development. Progress reports are sent home on a half termly basis and there are two Academic Tutoring days per year to which students and parents/carers are invited to discuss how the student is doing. These provide the ideal opportunity to meet subject teachers and tutors to ensure everything at College is going to plan.

## As a College we are committed to developing opportunities and experiences beyond the classroom.

The Woking Way is a unique programme designed to provide students with a breadth of opportunities beyond the classroom. Our extensive enrichment programme, providing over 75 activities across each week, sits at its core.

All students participate in at least one enrichment activity which is added to their academic programme and have the opportunity to participate in a range of additional activities such as workshops, pop ups, lectures and trips, in addition to qualifications such as EPQ and LAMDA and our Excellence Programme. Students work towards achieving their Woking Way awards, collating evidence in each of the programmes 5 areas; Wellbeing, What Next, Wider Learning, Working with the Community and World of Work.

The programme prepares students for their next steps in life and students value the breadth of experience and opportunities it provides.

## **WIDER LEARNING**

We challenge students to broaden their learning either as an extension to their chosen courses, through Maths and Science Olympiads, or as an additional learning opportunity with the EPQ programme and LAMDA.

#### WELLBEING

We recognise that an important part of our role is to support and enable students to look after their own wellbeing. To achieve this component, students will be encouraged to participate in sports enrichments, performing arts, wellbeing workshops, pop ups and focused events.

## **WORKING WITH THE COMMUNITY**

We encourage involvement with an array of community endeavours so that students are outward-focused. Schemes include Duke of Edinburgh Award, peer mentoring, volunteering and sports and performing arts coaching in local schools. Our community projects also provide tutor groups to plan and lead a community event.

## WHERE NEXT?

We maximise the chances students have to consider their next steps by providing a whole host of events. Students join careers days, Higher Education fairs and talks, apprenticeship trips and university open days.

#### **WORLD OF WORK**

We support students to gain real-world employment experience through enterprise schemes, employability events, work experience trips and external speakers.

## **Excellence Programme**

The Excellence Programme is designed to support aspirational and inquisitive students in their pursuit of excellence at College and in their future progression. The programme is targeted at ambitious students who demonstrate a passion for learning and commitment in their pursuit of securing places at leading universities, art schools or competitive apprenticeship programmes, as well as developing as an individual and an academic.

The programme is divided into four strands; Humanities & Social Sciences, The Arts, STEM, and Physical Life, which encompasses Medicine, Dentistry & Veterinary Sciences and Sport. Students meet within their strands once a week from January until December, where they will participate in seminars delivered by academics from leading universities, workshops from guest practitioners, hear from captains of industry and be provided with a range of opportunities to develop their cultural capital and encourage personal growth. Strand coordinators ensure students are provided with a wellrounded programme and facilitate external opportunities such as visiting an Oxford University College, as well as hosting internal opportunities such as regular workshops from Brighton & Sussex Medical School, Girls in STEM events and industry days throughout the year.

Within the programme, students who wish to apply for Oxbridge will receive training from admissions tutors from Oxford and Cambridge throughout the year, workshops to prepare for admissions tests and a full mock interview programme. Further to Oxbridge, strand leads are well versed in the individual application routes for competitive courses and apprenticeships and will offer students on the programme specialist support with these.

The Excellence Programme prides itself on inclusivity and supporting all students unlock their potential. The key criteria for participating is curiosity, aspiration and a love for learning.

# **Chemical Engineer**

**AMBITION** 

The Extended Project Qualification is an independent research project - your opportunity to gain a qualification in whichever area of interest you choose, anything from a hobby to a future career.

The final product can take the form of a written report or an artefact or product/ event. The EPQ involves students taking on independent learning and has teachers acting as supervisors. The EPQ begins in the September of year 12 and submission for marking is June of year 12. You will have timetabled sessions with supervisors who will give you guidance and one-toone meetings to support your progress. The EPQ is highly valued by universities as it demonstrates passion and ability in a particular subject. It is worth up to 28 UCAS points and can enhance your university applications. It also helps you develop a wide range of skills

**Extended Project Qualification** 

(for example academic writing, referencing and research) which will supplement your performance in your A Level exams and BTECS, as well as your next steps.





# WELLBEING

## **Learning support**

We aim to provide holistic, personalised and fully integrated support for all students according to their needs and circumstances. In the first few weeks after enrolment, using diagnostic screening, as well as information provided from home and school, Support for Learning staff will create an agreed plan to address any particular needs.

A dedicated, quiet and relaxed Support for Learning area is available in the B Building throughout the week, where specialist staff can provide assistance for all students. There is also further specialist mentoring and in class support available to students with an EHCP according to their need and preference and trained ELSAs (Emotional Literacy Support Assistants) to give bespoke support to students where this is required. The Support for Learning team also run specific workshops in revision, organisation and wellbeing and can provide ad hoc one-to-one support sessions to any student on request.

## **Personal tutoring**

When you enrol at Woking College you will be allocated a specialist personal tutor. They provide a comprehensive induction to help you in your transition from school to college. You will meet with your tutor every week and they will keep you up to date on key news and exciting opportunities in College as well as delivering tutorial sessions. Your personal tutor will also meet with you regularly for one-to-one reviews. They will monitor your progress and set you challenging targets to ensure you meet your full potential.

Your personal tutor will guide you through your options after college and help you to make those big decisions about your future, assisting you in applications to university, apprenticeships and employment.

Early in the first term parents/carers are invited to meet personal tutors and are actively encouraged to get in touch with them if they have any concerns or questions.

## Woking Way Pastoral Programme



Our pastoral curriculum is a continually evolving programme of activities, events and opportunities designed to provide all our students with the kinds of skills, knowledge and cultural awareness that we would expect from every young adult.

With interesting and interactive sessions covering everything from driving safety, current affairs and budgeting through to how to be a responsible citizen, the programme aims to equip you with a range of practical and useful skills and knowledge ready for you to take your next steps into living independently at university or within the world of work.

## **Heads of Year**

Our highly experienced Heads of Year are here for you if you have a more complex issue. Whether personal or academic, they can provide comprehensive guidance offering safe and non-judgemental support and advice to students regarding a wide range of issues.

## Learning Resource Centre

The Learning Resource Centre (LRC) is a dedicated quiet study area with networked computers and desks and cubicles for individual study. The LRC is open from 8am – 6pm for students to study in a quiet, calm space.

# HOW DO I GET THERE?

Woking College is the best-connected College in the region. With excellent rail, road and bus routes, Woking College attracts students from a wide geographical area.

Based on a single site with playing fields, we are placed in a residential area close to the town centre of Woking with good access to a mainline station.



By train: Woking College is a 15-minute walk from Woking Station, and a regular bus service connects the station to the College. Rail links from all major stations in the area are fast and efficient.



By bus: The College is on national and local bus routes from the areas of Camberley, Chertsey and Guildford. Subsidised passes for travel between home and the College are available from Surrey County Council.



**By road:** The College is easily accessible by road and there is ample free parking for all students and visitors.



**By foot:** It is a 15-minute walk from Woking town centre.



**By bike:** We strongly encourage you to cycle to College and have many undercover cycling bays.



If you're travelling by train, remember that students qualify for travelcards, which give discounted rail fares.
